### History Of Aviation Presentation

Friday 10<sup>th</sup> May saw a small group assemble for an excellent presentation given by Ross Skingley on the 'History of Army Aviation'. His videos charted its beginnings in the late 18th Century with balloon flights to the pioneering and precarious human powered flights at the turn of the century, and since then aviation has played an key role within



the army. Early developments centred around reconnaissance, but with the onset of the First World War and the battle for air superiority, developments came quickly and roles shifted to as much attack as reconnaissance. This sparked changes to the way aircraft were developed, so that the specialisation of aircraft began to occur, with specialised roles within the army. This continued apace even into the 1930 and 40s so that many types of aircraft played critical roles throughout the Second World War, including the gliders of the D-Day landings. But it wasn't until the late 1950s that the Army Air Corps as it is know today, with its headquarters in Middle Wallop, came into being. Specific aircraft development and procurement continued apace as technology improved, but from the 1960s there was a change of emphasis in favour of the more versatile rotary aircraft, culminating with the Apache and its array of technical equipment in use today.



We were also treated to a number fascinating video diaries from Army Air Corps personnel, including Prince Harry, made during their recent service in Afghanistan.

Donations from the evening totalled £27 and have been passed onto the 'Help The Heroes' charity.



Two enthusiastic teams set out from the village hall car park. When we met up again, an hour and a half later, we were a very patriotic looking group: all red-cheeked from the wind, with white and blue hands from the cold. Despite the chill, we were buoyed up by the warmth of the response on the doorstep.

The campaign ended on the eve of poll when on a balmy late afternoon we canvassed around the Haverhill part of Withersfield.

By that time, I had put in so many miles that my walking shoes needed to be re-soled and heeled.

Across the country, many people saw these elections as a chance to make a protest vote about national issues. Here, I asked all of you I met on the doorstep to focus on the local issues that most concerned you. I undertook to listen to your concerns and to speak up for you. I promise I will continue to do so.

I am trying to organise surgeries around the Clare Division so you can meet me in person. In the meantime if you have any issues you want to raise with me, or information about village events you would like me to attend, please do not hesitate to get in touch.

## Parish Council News

The Parish Council (PC) met on Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> May. This was the meeting following the Annual Village Meeting (AVM) the therefore election of officers for the PC is required. After considerable discussion it was agreed that due to Councillor Sylvester-Bradley's current work commitments it would be in the best interests of the PC to elect a new chairman, and in this respect previous Vice-chairman Councillor Kiddy was duly elected Chairman, with Councillor Joyce elected as Vice-chairman. Councillor Smith continues as footpaths officer. The remaining members of the council are Councillor Sylvester-Bradley, Councillor Parsons and Councillor Willington, with Parish Clerk John Barnett.

**There is still one vacancy for a councillor, so please come and talk to any of the current council if you are interested.**

- The minutes of the AVM were approved and all who attended agreed it was a very good evening.
- The contract has been renewed for the Village Hall broadband, with BT. This will allow more computer courses to be run. The Clerk is to try to source further funding for these courses which have proven to be very popular and useful.
- An allotment workshop is being held in Bury St. Ed's in July, which Councillor Smith and the Clerk will attend given the interest shown for allotments in the village.
- The Council agreed to pay a donation towards the cost of a silver band for the Church Fete, which all agreed would be a welcome addition to proceedings.
- There was a discussion regarding which suggestions of, how to deal with dog fouling put forward at the AVM, should be adopted. Currently there seems to be an improvement with regard to fouling. It was a welcome surprise – Keep it up please!
- The final item was to approve the council's draft accounts ready to pass to the internal auditor.

The next meeting is scheduled for **Wednesday 26th June at 7:30pm in the Village Hall.**

Parishioners are reminded that as always time is set aside at the beginning of each meeting for anyone to raise any issue they wish to discuss.

## The Old Airfield At Stradishall

On **Friday 7th June – 6.30pm** at the Village Hall – there will be a presentation about the old airfield at former RAF Stradishall. Over the last two years we have bought back the old airfield from the Ministry of Defence. It was compulsory purchased from the family in the 1930s to create RAF Stradishall. We have developed an ‘Integrated Strategy’ to revive the area which is now known by its historic name, **Broxted**. In creating the ‘Integrated Strategy’, the idea has been to draw together some of the best aspects in contemporary rural life and business. The Strategy therefore covers a wide range of activities such as arable farming, the creation of renewable energy through a large solar farm, conservation management, grazing by sheep and cattle, woodland management, hedgerow planting, the encouragement of wildlife, the provision of public access and Community involvement. I hope, and think, that it is an exciting project!

I shall be joined by Les Bunyan who has been taking a close interest in the wildlife (particularly the birds) on the old airfield and, as ever, has been taking some remarkable photographs!

I very much hope you will be able to join us!

### Les and Anne's Nature Notes

#### It looks just like its name.

On a recent visit to the Norfolk coast Anne and I called at Cley Marshes and got to see one of the most strange looking birds. As you can see from the photo, it's a Spoonbill. They became extinct as a British breeding bird back in the 17th century but I'm glad to say that in the last few years a small number have been regular visitors to eastern England and breeding occurred at Holkham last year. Also on that trip we saw some 30 Yellow Wagtails. Now it was hard to identify them because they were about 200 yards away, so you can imagine our delight, only a few days later, when we saw one near Water Lane close up! This is the most striking bird and yellow it most certainly is. It is not to be confused with the Grey Wagtail which has yellow on its front and underparts.



We are lucky here in Great Bradley that we have a pair of greys breeding near the river. By the time you read this they should have young out and about - look for them near the Church.

Exciting news reached us recently when we were told that a Mandarin Duck was nesting. We have had these oriental ducks for a couple of years now but this is the first time we can be sure they have bred. We found the nest hole and will be keeping an eye out for their young. Finally it's great to see the Swallows, House Martins and Swifts back with us, a sure sign that Summer, despite the weather, is here!

### Computer Courses at the Village Hall

Following the successful completion of three courses held at the Village Hall, two more will be on offer from the beginning of July. The courses will be held on Thursdays and each will consist of 4 x 2½ hour sessions.

The subject of the morning course will be Microsoft Excel Spreadsheets and will cater for people with little or no experience of Excel. The course will include the following topics:-

- Creating a workbook
- Inserting and deleting cells, rows, columns and worksheets.



- Formatting worksheet data.
- Working with cell formulas and functions.
- Working with charts.

The afternoon course will build on some of the topics covered in the first two courses and include:

- Using your mouse
- Working with windows.
- Organising your data.
- Further use of the internet.
- Useful shortcuts.
- File and folder structures.
- Changing the appearance of the desktop etc.

Up to six people can be accommodated in each 2½ hour session and Windows laptop computers are provided, although participants can bring their own laptops if they prefer. 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
