Newer residents of Great Bradley may not realise that the Village Hall is owned and maintained by the villagers. When the school closed the hall was bought by the village and is run as a charity. The management, maintenance and day to day running of the hall is undertaken by a small committee of volunteers who give up their time to do this. We receive no money from the County Council but the Parish Council donate money from their tight budget every year. Other income comes from hiring the hall to various clubs and activities, see listings in the monthly Bugle, and private hire for children's parties, wakes etc. We strive to put on various events throughout the year which we hope will interest residents of Great Bradley. Sadly we had to cancel the Children's Christmas party in December due to lack of response, despite this being a huge success last year! Community Speedwatch

In Great Bradley one of our volunteers has just had to stand down due to work commitments. We still have 3 volunteers but need at least another one, preferably two, to assist. We train all new volunteers ourselves 'at the roadside'.

We have a new large Vehicle Activated Sign (VAS) which we are beginning to use in conjunction with the radar gun at the speedchecks to illustrate to drivers their actual speed and demonstrate the reason we are there. We operate in the Spring through to Autumn approximately once every 3-4 weeks for a couple of hours usually around the rush period.

Our aim is to educate drivers to the fact that there is a 30mph speed limit through the village and make it safer for everyone.

Parish Council News

A meeting of the Great Bradley Parish Council (GBPC) was held on the 25th January. Pat Spires was co-opted onto The Council, filling one of 2 vacancies.

County Councillor Mary Evans attended and informed us that Suffolk County Council has agreed total cuts of £38M this year, this will not effect schools or fire services.

Speeding through villages is still on the agenda and ways to reduce this are still being investigated.

Plans for the village garden will be drawn up soon so this area can be planted.

New computer courses will start during March, at least one of these will be on Microsoft Excel [details below and p.11.]

Work has started on creating a village archive.

The Police reported no crimes in Great Bradley since the last PC meeting. Eleven speed checks have taken place on the B1061 resulting in 2 fixed penalty tickets being issued.

A letter has been received regarding dog fouling becoming an issue again.

The Litter Pick has been scheduled for 29th March [details p. 3.]

The next PC meeting will be held on the 19th March.

The Annual Village Meeting will be held on the 9th April.

Computer Courses at the Village Hall

The Village Hall has hosted a number of computer courses over the last couple of years. This Spring we will be running two more courses.

The first course subject will be Windows 8 and 8.1. With the announcement that Microsoft will be withdrawing support for Windows XP, many people will need either to purchase a new computer or upgrade their existing equipment to the latest Windows 8/8.1. This system adopts a very different approach and is more tuned to computers, smart-phones and tablets with touch screens. There have been many desktop and laptop users very unhappy with Windows 8/8.1 as it is so very different in many ways from previous Windows systems. The course will introduce participants to the new way of working and give them more confidence to use the revised interface. This course will run in the morning.



The second course will be dealing with Microsoft Excel Spreadsheets and will be for newcomers but also a useful reminder and follow-up for those who took the first course last year. This course will run in the afternoon.

These courses will take place in the Village Hall and consist of 5 x 2 hour weekly sessions commencing on 13th March. The morning sessions will commence at 10am and finish at 12:15 including a 15 minute break. The afternoon sessions will commence at 2pm and finish at 4.15pm including a 15 minute break. The cost for each 10 hour course remains at £10.00. Up to seven people can be accommodated in each two hour session and Windows laptop computers are provided, although participants can bring their own laptops if they prefer. If anyone has ideas for different subjects they would like to learn about please let us know, and if there is sufficient interest it may be able to be included at a future date.

There will be a further course to be run in the Autumn (dates to be advised) and is entitled "Getting to Know

Your Computer Part 4” and follows on from previous courses to show participants how to use their computers more efficiently; use email and the internet with confidence and troubleshoot everyday problems.

The courses are open to all ages and remember you are never too old to learn and we aim to have some fun during the sessions. Please contact **John Barnett on 01440 783903** for more information and/or to register for the courses.

A Time for Reflection

As some of you are aware, Anne and I will soon be leaving the Village, so I thought I would look back on what has been a wonderful 13 years in Great Bradley. It took a few years just to get to know our new patch and many weekends were spent walking all the footpaths. It soon became apparent that there was an abundance of birds and other wildlife to be observed. We got to know the place quite well so much so that we could almost predict what we would see and where it would be! Hares for instance in good numbers near Bradley Park Wood along with Roe, Muntjac and Fallow Deer, Bullfinches and Yellowhammers in Water Lane, Grey Wagtails in the covered yard next to the Church etc., etc. Some things took longer to find, it was several



years before we spotted our first Kingfisher but with a bit of patience we ended up getting great views of this beautiful bird. I well remember finding a nest hole and waiting eagerly for the young to appear. Hours of sitting by the river finally paid off and 3 young ones gave me great views at close quarters. We have noted the increase in the Buzzard population and it is a rare day when we don't see one now. A count one year of

12 flying high over Clarendale was a sight to behold. Birds of prey have always been my personal favourites and the odd Red Kite and Peregrine Falcon along with Hobby and of course Kestrel have all been seen locally.

Barn Owls became part of our lives in 2010 when the nest box went up, and we still recall with great excitement the first time we held new born chicks when they were ringed. Tawny Owls all over the place, even in the corner of our garden one night, but a real treat was the Short Eared Owl that was along the river in May 2012. A few Little Egrets now over-winter along the river and another first was the breeding of Mandarin Ducks.

Foxes hunting on the green outside our house on Clarendale at night, the odd Hedgehog, an increasingly rare sight these days and Badgers in a few secret locations have given us so much enjoyment over the years. We would like to give a special mention to Charles and his family who have gave us the permission to roam where we pleased and record and photograph the Great Bradley Estate and it's nice to think that the project we undertook in 2009 will be part of Great Bradley history for the future.



We could fill the entire Bugle with so many good things we have seen over the years, but for now that's it.

Anne and I came to the Village knowing no one but we will leave having made lovely friends. We will look on our time in Great Bradley as Volume 1 of our married life together and will dip into it's pages no doubt on many occasions, but now it's time to write Volume 2 as we head off to North Norfolk. We will leave you with a few photos.

Microsoft Announces Withdrawal of Support for Windows XP

Microsoft has announced that it will withdraw support for Windows XP in April. So what will this mean to you if you are currently using a computer running Windows XP? After 8th April, technical support for Windows XP will no longer be available, including automatic updates that help protect your PC. Microsoft will also stop providing Microsoft Security Essentials for download on Windows XP on this date. If you already have Microsoft Security Essentials installed you will continue to receive anti-malware signature updates for a limited time, but this does not mean that your PC will be secure, because Microsoft will no longer be providing security updates to protect your PC.



If you continue to use Windows XP after support ends, your computer will still work but it might become more vulnerable to security risks and viruses. Also, as more software and hardware manufacturers continue to optimise for more recent versions of Windows, you can expect to encounter greater numbers of apps and devices that do not work with Windows XP.

So if you want to stay protected after support ends, you have two options: upgrade your current computer or buy a new PC! Unfortunately very few older computers will be able to run Windows 8.1, which is the latest version of Windows. It is recommended that you download and run the Windows Upgrade Assistant, from the Microsoft website, to check if your PC meets the system requirements for Windows 8.1 and then follow the steps in the tutorial to upgrade if your PC is compatible. If your current PC can't run Windows 8.1, it might be time to consider shopping for a new one. Generally you will find that the average price of a new computer is considerably less expensive than the average desktop or laptop was 10 years ago.

Of course, if you use your computer just for word processing or games and you do not connect to the internet, this loss of support will cause you little problem, but you will become increasingly vulnerable if you copy files from other computers as the operating system becomes increasingly out of date.

So if the thought of learning to use the new version Windows fills you with dread why not enrol in the new five week course at the Village Hall starting on March 13th. Suffolk Fostering Services

There are currently around 750 children in care in Suffolk, the majority of these are in foster care, and placed with our own registered foster carers.

Suffolk County Council wants all children in its care to have a permanent, safe home in which they will be loved, nurtured and thrive. For some this will be with members of their family, while for others the best option will be for them to be adopted or be with a permanent fostering family.

People who foster/adopt can...

1. Be any age over 21
2. Be married , single , divorced, or in a civil partnership
3. Be gay/lesbian , bisexual or heterosexual
4. Rent or own their home

5. Be disabled
6. Be of any ethnicity, race, religion or culture
7. Already have children or not

We know that many people can be hesitant to come forward and take the next step to either foster or adopt, and need some encouragement or re-assurance that they will receive a quick and sensitive response with answers to any initial questions they may have.

Suffolk Fostering Service needs carers for children of all ages, but is particularly interested in hearing from people able to care for sibling groups or children over the age of 11.

Foster carers receive ongoing and regular supervision, support and training.

Foster carers can provide care on a short-term basis whilst permanent plans are made for children to return home to birth family or to an adoptive family. Alternatively, they can provide care on a long-term or permanent basis where the child will become a part of the carer's family until they are ready to leave home, but hopefully throughout their adult life too.

There are also specialised schemes such as the MTFC Zipwire programme for children over the age of seven who have more complex and challenging needs. MTFC Zipwire offers carers structured support and a fee which represents the complexity of the task of caring for children with additional needs.

Alternatively, there is the LINK service which supports children and young people with learning, physical or sensory disability, and their families by providing regular short breaks.

Foster carer Jackie says ' Being a foster carer gives me a huge sense of pride in what I am doing – to make such a difference, and to be part of, and share, a child's life is so gratifying'
